H.O.P.E. PARTICIPANTS MUST BE ABLE TO

- Walk on uneven and soft surfaces without assistance.
- Remain with the group, with verbal prompts from staff.
- Demonstrate behavior appropriate for a family friendly environment.
- Current ability to safely use farm tools such as a shovel, rake and wheelbarrow.
- Comfortable engaging in prevocational activities near farm animals.
- Remain safe independently on the farm, with verbal prompts from staff.
- Tolerate loud noises from tractors, farm animals, crowds.



The H.O.P.E. program is a small, close-knit prevocational group in which participants will learn work skills to provide success, confidence and education they can take with them to their work force or volunteer path. As they prepare for that shift, they will have the unique opportunity of engaging with farm life which will include but is not limited to, animal care, gardening, agriculture and nature. Our Skills Instructors will teach independence and professionalism while pursuing long-term skills for the workplace.
